The Seminole Scholars T32 Database Program is managed in collaboration between the FSU CTSA and the Vice President of Research.

The program supports faculty applying for NIH T32 Institutional Research Training Grants.

T32 submissions planned for 2026 are being led by: Drs. Nicole Ennis, Angelina Sutin, Patrick Stover, and Regan Bailey.

The National Institute of Health (NIH) Institutional Research Training Grants (T32s) enable institutions to recruit and train individuals at the predoctoral and/or postdoctoral-level in a specific shortage area. The goal of these grants is to prepare trainees for careers that will have a significant impact of the health of the United State public.

This program has supported two T32 grant applications to date:

- FSU MPIs: Drs. Lisa Hightow-Weidman (Nursing), Sylvie Naar (Medicine), and Jing Wang (Nursing)
- FSU PI: Dr. Carla Wood (College of Communication Sciences and Disorders)

The Seminole Scholars T32

Database Program is a new service at FSU that maintains information on potential mentors and trainees. Currently, the program offers:

- Mentor Identification
- T32 Data Table Development
- Data Table Review/Revision

We require at a minimum 3 months of lead time for mentor identification and data table revisions and at a minimum 4 months for developing data tables from scratch.
